Earnings

The median annual wage for occupational therapists was \$80,150 in May 2015. The median wage is the wage at which half therefore in an occupation earned more than that amount and half earned less. The ktwle percent earned less than \$53,250, and the highest 10 percent earned more than \$116,030.

Educational Requirements

- f Beginning in 2007, a master's degree or high cocupational therapy will be the minimum educational requirement.
- f To obtain a license, applicants musa durate from an accredited educational program and pass a national certificatexamination. Those who pass the exam are awarded the title "Occupational Registered (OTR)."
- f Occupational therapists are increasinglying on supervisory roles, allowing assistants and aides to work more elpswith clients under the guidance of a therapist, in an effort toeduce the cost of therapy.
- f More than a quarter of occupated therapists work part time.

Educational Programs
